Investor outlook

Investors are buoyant about their financial outlook and the prospects for their investments, perhaps as memories of the Liberation day tariffs earlier in the year begin to fade. The UK savings ratio remains high, and investors expect to buy new shares, open new accounts and increase the amount they invest.

Best buying opportunities

The UK remains seen as the best buying opportunity, maintaining a lead over the US throughout 2025. The gulf between tech and the rest increases. There's been a sizable increase in those seeing Crypto as a best buying opportunity, making it the joint best buy opportunity (albeit tied with 3 other assets).

Investor tribes



The 'Bold & Brave' tribe are most likely to think their personal finances will get better, their investments will get better and they will invest more in the next 12 months than any other tribe.




Investor Sentiment



Outlook on personal finances is good but looking to the next 12 months, the proportion think their finances will get better is negated by the same proportion thinking they will get worse










Half of investors are positive about their personal finances, two in five think they will get better still in the next 12 months





Half of investors rate their investment performance as good. Again, two in five expect it to get better still in the next 12 months










Half of investors think current investment opportunities are good, while two in five expect them to get better over the next 12 months









Q - How would you rate investment opportunities is to be in next 12 months?



The UK savings ratio remains high, driven largely by investors







Q – Are you saving more or less now compared to 12 months ago?

Q - Do you expect to do any of the following over the next 12 months?




Best Buying Opportunities



Throughout the whole of 2025, the UK has been seen as a better buying opportunity than they US. The UK maintains a +6pp lead over the US

Best buying opportunities: Markets




Q - Which markets do you think present the best buying opportunities for the next 12 months?

Best buying opportunities: Asset Class




Q - Which asset classes do you think present the best buying opportunities for the next 12 months?



A large gap has opened up between tech and the rest. Consistently around 30% of investors don't know where the best buying opportunities lie


Best buying opportunities: Sectors

THE GROWTH HUNTERS Avg. Assets: £93,272

This older segment includes a notable proportion of women alongside men who typically make independent decisions when it comes to investing

THE BOLD AND BRAVE NEXT GEN Avg. Assets: £72,978

This younger, diverse group with an equal mix of women and men invests with goals centred on enhancing their lifestyle and wellbeing

THE PEACE OF MIND MOB Avg. Assets: £61,268

This older segment includes a notable proportion of women alongside men who typically seek input from financial professionals for their investment decisions


THE SHORT-TERM HOBBYISTS Avg. Assets: £59,976

This group, a younger and gender-diverse investor segment, tends to prioritise short-term financial goals over long-term wealth building

THE EXPERIENCED HIGH ROLLERS Avg. Assets: £109,940


This predominantly older, male group approaches investing with diverse goals - funding career transitions, building inheritance, maintaining lifestyle, & securing retirement

Half of the 'Bold & Brave tribe' expect their personal finances to get better over the next 12 months, compared to less than a quarter of the 'Peace of Mind Mob'






